This minor introduces students to the Latin language and enables them to read, in Latin, important works of Latin literature.

Students interested in pursuing this minor should consult with the Program Director or the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of Classics. The minor is valuable both for the intrinsic interest of the subject and for the related skills that contribute to higher scores on the GRE exam. Those who enjoyed Latin in high school are encouraged to continue their studies at Maryland.

REQUIREMENTS

For students with no prior experience of Latin, the minor requires 21 credits, consisting of the following courses:

Students who enter with advanced standing in Latin can complete the minor by taking a total of five courses in Latin at the 2xx level and beyond.
